The first man, Väinämöinen, borns to the goddess Ilmatar.




Väinämöinen is a shaman who lives in village called Kalevala.

Joukahainen loses and he is scared. He promises that his sister Aino can marry Väinämöinen.







Aino prefers her freedom.

Ilmarinen refuses to go to Pohjola so Väinämöinen forces him against his will. He makes the Sampo. Ilmarinen returns without a bride.



Väinämöinen and Ilmarinen sail back to Pohjola to take the Sampo back. While on their journey they kill a monstrous pike and from its jaw bone the first kantele is made.

The heroes arrive in Pohjola and they meet Louhi and her army. Väinämöinen plays Kantele and with his music he makes everyone in Pohjola sleep.


When Louhi wakes up she turns herself into an eagle and fights for the Sampo. In the battle the Sampo disappears in to the sea.






Water elfs, fish and seamonsters live in Ahtola.
